The following information is applicable for eInstruction Corporation products (eInstruction, Interwrite, and GTCO Calcomp brands).

End user Requirement is that they must have Waste of Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) disposed and treated properly in regard to the Decree n° 2005-829 of 20 July 2005 relating to the composition of electrical and electronic equipment and to the elimination of waste from this equipment.

The end-user will deliver eInstruction Corporation's waste of electrical and electronic equipment to the following collection point for de-pollution, disassembly, reprocessing, recovery or preparation for disposal and will contact the following:
